

Background

Emma Pendleton Bradley Hospital, which opened in 1931, was the nation's first psychiatric hospital devoted exclusively to children and adolescents, and today remains the only such hospital in the region.

Created by the wills of George and Helen Bradley in memory of their daughter Emma, Bradley Hospital provides a continuum of inpatient, school, residential, partial, outpatient and special education services for infants through adolescents. A major teaching affiliate and research center of The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University, Bradley Hospital is world renowned for its expertise in child and adolescent psychiatry. There are Fellowships in child and adolescent psychiatry, combined residents in pediatrics, psychiatry, child psychiatry, and post-doctoral psychology residents and fellows that receive training in Bradley Hospital's programs every year.

In collaboration between Bradley Hospital and Hasbro Children's Hospital, the unique Medical Psychiatric Program is the only program in the region designed to provide family-based integrated care for young people struggling with psychiatric and medical illness at the same time. The unit, on the sixth floor of Hasbro Children's is composed of 16 beds, for patients ages 12 to 18.

Location and Service Area

Bradley Hospital is located on 35 acres of land in East Providence, Rhode Island. Acute inpatient services are provided to children and adolescents with serious psychiatric problems and/or autism and developmental disabilities. Outpatient services offer comprehensive mental health evaluation and treatment for children, adolescents and families. Residential programs are located in Warwick, Cranston, Pawtucket, East Providence, North Providence and Exeter, Rhode Island. Referrals to Bradley come from throughout the United States; its primary service area spans Rhode Island and southeastern Massachusetts.

The Bradley School

This state-licensed, certified special education school is operated by Lifespan School Solutions, Inc. a subsidiary of Bradley Hospital. In addition to embedded classrooms in several school districts in

Rhode Island, they enroll students at its five free-standing locations.

Clinical Staff

Bradley's clinical staff includes board-certified child psychiatrists and psychologists, neuropsychologists, pediatricians, master level social workers and counselors, advanced degree and registered nurses with psychiatric expertise, certified special education teachers, speech-language pathologists, genetic counselors, board certified behavior analysts (BCBA), occupational therapists and behavioral health specialists.

From Points North

Take I-95 South to Providence to I-195 East. Take Exit 1C (Taunton Avenue/Riverside). Keep right on the ramp to Veterans Memorial Parkway. Continue 2.5 miles. Hospital is on the right at the traffic light.

From Points South

Take I-95 North to Providence to I-195 East then same as above.

From Points East

Take I-195 West to East Providence exit (Exit 1C). At the end of the exit take a left onto Broadway. Continue 2.3 miles until you reach Veterans Memorial Parkway. Take a left on the parkway. Hospital is on the right at the traffic light.

From Points West

Take Hartford Avenue (Route 6A) to I-295 South to U.S. Route 6 East. Merge to left at end of U.S. Route 6, and take Route 10 North toward Providence. Take I-95 South exit. Take I-95 South to I-195 East. Then same as From Points North.
