Holiday period with the highest average percentage of alcohol-impaired traffic deaths: **New Year's** at 42%

Holiday period with the overall greatest number of motor vehicle-related fatalities: **Thanksgiving**, with an average of 444 deaths for the entire holiday period. (The Thanksgiving holiday period always spans four days.)
