Are you pregnant and using hookah?

How does the research process work?

Researchers at Women & Infants Hospital are investigating the impact various flavors and features of hookah have on pregnancy. We are looking for pregnant women who have used hookah when pregnant or up to three months before becoming pregnant to participate.

Who is eligible? The study is open to women who:

- Are between the ages of 18 and 40.
- Are pregnant.
- Have used hookah during their pregnancy or up to three months before becoming pregnant.

How long will the research last? Your study participation will last approximately 12 months.

What will I need to do during the research study?

You will be asked to complete three interviews, two during your pregnancy and one after your baby is born. These interviews include questionnaires about your experience and thoughts about using hookah. We will also complete an exam with your baby within a few days after delivery.

Researchers will also collect:

- Pictures of the hookah you use and where you use it.
- Saliva, urine and breath samples.
