


PGY1 Pharmacy Residency

Work collaboratively as a member of our Brown Health Medical Group Primary Care (formerly Coastal Medical) team to prevent and alleviate medication-related problems and optimize patient outcomes.

Receive training in the delivery of direct patient care, the enhancement of professional interpersonal skills, academic teaching, student precepting, and management skills.

The Residency

In the Brown Health Primary Care/URI program, residents collaborate with a healthcare team to prevent medication-related issues and optimize patient outcomes. Training includes direct patient care, professional communication, academic teaching, student precepting, and management skills.

Clinical experiences cover adult internal medicine, diabetes, cardiology, pulmonology, smoking cessation, and pain management. Residents also complete a medication class review and provide drug information services while on rotation at the URI Drug Information Services.

Our precepting environment fosters strong teaching skills and our research staff is an excellent resource for residents for developing a solid foundation in research design and analysis.

The resident will meet quarterly with the residency program director to tailor the resident's schedule to meet individual goals. Upon completion of the program, the resident will be awarded an ASHP accredited residency certificate if all program requirements are met.

Benefits

- 1-year stipend in the total amount of \$53,000
- Eligible for Brown Health Primary Care health insurance coverage
- 10 vacation days and 5 sick days
- Travel reimbursement to present a project at a clinical meeting
- · A dedicated workspace and a laptop computer

Qualifications

Qualifications for participation in the Brown Health Primary Care/URI PGY1 Residency Program are in accordance with the criteria set forth by the American Society of Health System Pharmacists (ASHP). Residents shall be: graduates of an Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited Doctor of Pharmacy degree program; licensed or eligible for licensure in RI; and participate in and obey the rules of the Residency Matching Program.

Pharmacy Services

Pharmacists are a part Brown Health Primary Care's population health strategy and integral members of our care management programs. Pharmacists work under a collaborative practice agreement and provide services to all our primary care practices.

Services include:

- · Chronic disease state management via visits in office or by telephone
- Opioid and antibiotic stewardship services
- Comprehensive medication reviews for targeted patients
- Anticoagulation management
- · Drug information services
- Medication adherence and quality services
- Participation in multidisciplinary care conferences

Pharmacy Program Structure

In this program, pharmacists have several unique roles:

· Role based pharmacists

- Assigned to a pharmacy service depending on the day of the week to provide clinical pharmacy services such as drug information, in person and telephonic patient education and anticoagulation management
- · Population health management pharmacists
 - Provides services to patients via the diabetes management program

Managed care pharmacists

- Works with payers to meet all medication-related quality measures and outcomes
- Supervises the pharmacy technician team, monitors patient adherence and provides services to improve medication access and lower medication costs

All pharmacists also participate in the education and training of advanced pharmacy practice experience students from the University of Rhode Island.

Letter of intent describing personal goals and reasons for pursuing the pharmacy residency; three letters of recommendation; curriculum vitae; and your official college transcript.
